Dear Judge Rindner:

We are writing on behalf of our client Eli Lilly and Company. During yesterday's hearing regarding the application of principles of comity to this matter, Your Honor requested Lilly provide a list of documents which are both subject to this Court's June 13 Order and available on the Internet due to the violation of Case Management Order No. 3 ("CMO-3") in MDL 1596. So far as we can determine there are only two documents which fit into this category: Plaintiff's Exhibit 4121 and Plaintiff's Exhibit Number 8262. The remaining three exhibits protected by CMO-3 and listed in Lilly's Amended Notice of Correcting Misstatement are not available on the Internet. Those documents are labeled as FDACDER and Plaintiff's Exhibit Numbers 3909 and 10052.

Further, during yesterday's hearing Your Honor asked Lilly whether any matters related to de-designating the confidential status of documents produced under CMO-3 involve documents beyond the scope of Judge Weinstein's February 14, 2008 Permanent Injunction Order. In fact, Judge Weinstein is presiding over matters where the confidentiality of documents is being challenged in a circumstance unrelated to the Injunction Order.

Judge Weinstein, with the assistance of Special Discovery Master Peter Woodin, is presiding over UFCW Local 1776 v. Eli Lilly and Company and Eric Tayag v. Eli Lilly and Company. In these cases, plaintiffs' counsel, Thomas Sobol, has sought declassification of hundreds of Lilly's confidential documents. This matter is unrelated to the Gottstein appeal. Mr.
